Background/Supporting Information Attached

The department is requesting to contract with Hennepin County to receive a third year of federal funding received through a grant from the state Department of Human Services to continue the Minnesota Family Investment Program (MFIP) Innovation project in 2014. This continues the pilot project to implement a single point of contact model to serve MFIP minor caregivers up to age 20 and their children, in partnership with the Minnesota Visiting Nurse Agency and Minneapolis Public Schools. This pilot is part of a long range plan for Hennepin County to restructure its services to implement the single point of contact model with its full MFIP teen parent population.
