Background/Supporting Information

The City of Minneapolis has begun an Enterprise Resources Planning Program to upgrade and improve the City's Human Resources and Financial systems along with the related reporting systems.

The City's Information Technology Department (IT) requests authorization to issue a Request for Proposals (RFP) for IT professional services needed to complete one

project within this program, the COMPASS Financial System Upgrade Project. The IT professional services for the project will be required for about one year, and the RFP will be released following approval from the City's Permanent Review Committee.

The COMPASS Upgrade Project will enable the City to be on a newer and better supported version of the software (PeopleSoft FSCM v9.2) and provides more functionality and efficiencies for the City. The upgraded system will allow better integration with the City's human resources and reporting systems, and includes functionality called Work Centers which allows Finance to create better work flow. Also included are: the ability to do more online through eForms, business process improvements in areas such as procure-to-pay and cash management, and Pivot Grids for easier data analysis.

Request for Approval
