Background/Supporting Information Attached

Since 1953, Keep America Beautiful (KAB) has been engaging individuals to take greater responsibility for improving their community environments. KAB has notified the City of Minneapolis that it is receiving a Cigarette Litter Prevention Program (CLPP) grant, in the amount of \$2,500. This grant is to implement this successful KAB program focused on preventing cigarette litter.

The Minneapolis program will focus on Cigarette litter in the Downtown area, and has four components:

- A Cigarette Litter Scan, to be conducted before program roll-out. This scan will be done by youth summer employees. The scan will give us baseline information on the amount of cigarette litter in downtown, and identify “hot spots” of concentrated cigarette litter.
- Placement of CLPP Public Service announcements, to remind people that cigarettes on the ground are litter, and are unacceptable in our community.
- Strategic Placement of Ash Receptacles at “transition points,” the places where smokers most tend to drop cigarettes before proceeding into a building, onto a bus, etc. These Receptacles will be placed similarly to the existing Adopt a Litter Container program.
- Distribution of 1,000 Pocket Ashtrays to adult smokers in the City. These are provided by KAB.
