## Supporting Information

1367 Willow Street South was formerly occupied by the Eitel Hospital. The site was redeveloped beginning in 2005 and is now occupied by the Eitel Building City Apartments, a three building complex of 213 units. The property includes approximately 2000 square feet of retail space, where developers plan to build a restaurant. The authorization for a license for on-sale intoxicating liquor in Chapter 311, Article 1, Section 5 is for this planned restaurant.

**Approving Laws of Minnesota 2008 Legislative Session; Chapter 311, Article 1, Section 5**

Whereas the Minnesota State Legislature has passed a law authorizing the City of Minneapolis to issue an on-sale intoxicating liquor license to a restaurant located at 1367 Willow Street South; and

Whereas the license authorizes sales on all days of the week.

Whereas, said legislation, by its terms requires an affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the City Council by the first day of the next regular session of the legislature before it may become effective; and

Now, therefore, Be It Resolved by the City Council of Minneapolis:

That the said law be now approved and the City Clerk be directed to prepare and file with the Secretary of State the required certification of approval.
