- For students that have a high interest in Science, helping others, learning about the human body, and learning to help people in times of stress or crisis
- For students that want a challenge during your 11th and 12th grade years
- You would take an Emergency Medical Responder class during the Spring of your Junior year after school, to begin to learn about Emergency Medicine and become a certified First Responder
- You would be invited to be a part of the Minneapolis Fire Department Explorers group that meets at local fire stations to practice skills, learn in a hands-on way, and be mentored by Fire Fighters who will help you to work towards success in the EMT program!
