There was no entry made at that time. Then, at around 0400 hours, that person returned, opened the gate, and backed a two-tone light over dark conversion van into the dock.</p> <p>The person then removed over a thousand dollars worth of scrap aluminum from a bin near the dock. The business has surveillance video of the incident. Officer viewed the footage, however, it is not clear enough for identifying a suspect with any certainty. The business will be making a copy of the surveillance video for the investigation.</p>	<p>Caller reported a male wearing a yellow vest with a power saw cutting railroad rails behind above business. Upon arrival, I observed suspect #1 cutting railroad rails with a power saw. Suspect #1 was ID'd by a MN State ID, and sent. Digital photographs taken of the damage. The memory card and saw were property inventories.</p>

# Criminal Court Process Terms

**A#/AP#:** Police report shorthand for “Arrestee”

**V#:** Police Report shorthand for “Victim”

**W#:** Police report shorthand for “Witness”

**OT#:** Police report shorthand for “Other”

**RP#:** Police report shorthand for “Reporting Person”

**HWB:** shorthand for “Hold Without Bail”

**Arraignment:** First appearance in court where Defendant is informed of the charges and enters a guilty or not guilty plea.

**Pretrial/Omnibus/Hearing:** Common terms used to indicate a criminal court hearing after an arraignment but before trial.

**Sentencing:** Court hearing where the case disposition is formally pronounced for Defendant.

**Stayed sentence/Stayed time:** A sentencing option where defendant is not required to serve a full jail term up front but instead is given the opportunity to be successful on probation while the possibility of serving that time hangs over their head contingent on complying with the ordered conditions.

**Departure:** A sentence given that is greater or lesser than the presumed sentence based on factors articulated by the sentencing Judge.

**Workhouse:** Common name of the Hennepin County Adult Corrections Facility in Plymouth where all convicted adults serve any imposed sentence that is under 365 days in length.

**DOC:** Department of Corrections, supervising agency for all prison sentences.

**Booked:** taken downtown and processed into the jail for the arrested crime

**PSF:** Public Safety Facility is the location downtown where arrestees are brought to jail for processing and holding pending court proceedings. This building also houses three courtrooms used for arraignment appearances.

**HCJ:** shorthand used by officers for Hennepin County Jail – which is now at the PSF

**PVH:** Court shorthand for a probation violation hearing. This occurs after a defendant has been sentenced and there has been an allegation that he/she has violated one of the conditions placed upon them during their probationary term. This may also be referred to as a “**Morrissey**” hearing.
