

**Beltrami Neighborhood Council**  
Neighborhood Priority Plan  
Continuation of 3 Phase II Strategies

Plan Development

In the summer of 2015, the Beltrami Neighborhood Council (BNC) developed a short survey to collect information on neighborhood priorities. Over the next several months, surveys were collected in a variety of ways:

- At BNC events: summer festival, Beltrami Ninja Warrior
- At BNC meetings: crime update meeting, beltrami park listening sessions
- Through social media: online survey posted on website, twitter, facebook, nextdoor, e-newsletters and printed & mailed newsletter
- Through door-knocking 3 blocks, two attempts

A total of 85 surveys were collected. The top three priorities identified through the survey are: park improvements, opening & staffing the park building, and lights & locks program.

Proposed Neighborhood Priority Plan

The Beltrami Neighborhood Council proposes the \$34,946 in NPP funds be contracted to continue three NRP Phase II Strategies as follows:

Phase II Parks & Recreation Strategy 2: Park Improvements Recreation (NPP \$25,000)

- *Beltrami Neighborhood Council will work with the Park Board to encourage healthful activities for youth and adults.*
- Potential projects: picnic shelter, wading pool, additional lighting

Phase II Parks & Recreation Strategy 1: Park Participation & Lunch Staffing (NPP \$5,000)

- *Beltrami Neighborhood Council will work with the Park Board to find ways to reopen the park building in the summer and to provide healthy lunches via the school meals program for neighborhood children who depend on these services for basic daily nutrition.*
- Potential projects: Supplemental funding for summer programming, supplies for programming

Phase II Crime Prevention & Livability Strategy 1: Block Clubs & Lighting (NPP \$4,946)

- *Coordinate community involvement to prevent and report crime.*
- Potential projects: home security grant, security strike plate program, block club development

Contracting the NPP funds as suggested above responds to the community's top three priorities as expressed in the NPP survey.
