18TH AVE S BRIDGE OVER MIDTOWN GREENWAY

Improving the condition of the bridge and providing safe connections for all



Project background

Constructed in 1916, the 18th Ave S bridge over the Midtown Greenway is planned to be improved with design and construction planned over the next few years. Motor vehicle use over the bridge has been restricted to a single lane and the bridge was load-posed to 26 tons in February of 2024, due to structural concerns. It remains open for pedestrians and bicyclists.

The bridge is located within the Railroad Grade Separation Historic District and is recognized as an important connection for the community as it supports access over and to the Midtown Greenway and businesses on Lake Street. The project will engage with many stakeholders, including the Lake Street Council, Midtown Greenway Coalition, and Four Sisters Urban Farm.

Fall 2023 - Summer 2024: Public Works will collect data.

Fall 2024– Spring 2025: Public Works will initiate communications, engagement with the public and will develop a concept cross section of the bridge deck.

Summer 2025: Public Works to provide a recommended concept of the bridge deck for the 18th Ave. bridge over the Midtown Greenway.

Fall 2026 - Fall 2027: Implementation of improvements to the 18th Ave. bridge.
