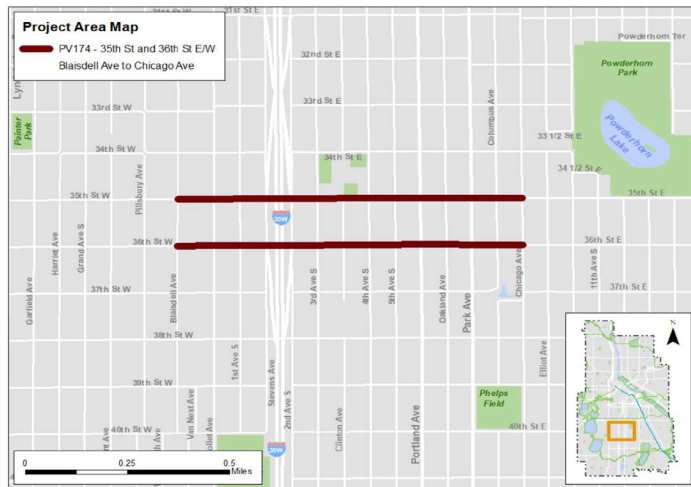


# 35TH AND 36TH STREET

## Reconstruction Project - Blaisdell Avenue to Chicago Avenue

### Project overview

The City is going to rebuild 35th and 36th streets between Blaisdell and Chicago avenues. The project is a full reconstruction project, involving the entire right-of-way. The area where the work will happen includes single-family housing with a mixture of apartment buildings, businesses, Green Central Elementary School, and Hosmer Library. This project aims to improve the right-of-way for all people in all the ways they move around. It will also update the street design to better meet the needs of the community.

### Project goals

- Design safer, calmer and more resilient streets
- Make sure people can walk, bike, roll and access transit safely and comfortably
- Replace and upgrade old streets, sidewalks and other public infrastructure
- Build streets that reflect the community's priorities and needs
- Include more green space and support healthy trees.
- Use green infrastructure to collect and treat stormwater.



### Existing Conditions

35th and 36th streets in the project area were built in the early 1960s. Even though a temporary fix was done in 2012 to make the pavement better, both streets are still old and in bad condition. Lots of people use these streets every day, with around 200 people walking, 90 people biking, and between 4,200 and 10,000 people driving. According to the City's Vision Zero Action Plan, both 35th Street and 36th Street are known to have had many serious crashes. So, the goal of the improvements is to make these streets safer to prevent more people from getting hurt or even losing their lives.

### Transportation Action Plan

This project is aligned with the Transportation Action Plan, the city's vision for safer, greener and more modern streets that serve all people and all the ways they want to get around.
