**LETTER OF AGREEMENT  
2020 Budgetary Leave Holiday Pay**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Minneapolis (“Employer”) and Minneapolis Building and Construction Trades Council, AFL-CIO, Trades Inspectors Unit (“Union”) are parties (collectively the “Parties”) to a collective bargaining agreement currently in effect; and,

**WHEREAS** as a result of the COVID-19 Pandemic, the Employer has experienced an unanticipated decrease in revenue after the city council and mayor had adopted a balanced budget and projects a 2020 revenue shortfall of \$165 million; and,

**WHEREAS**, in order to address the Employer’s 2020 revenue shortfall, the City requested that employees volunteer to take budgetary leave in order to assist the City save on wage costs.

**NOW THEREFORE, THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:**


1. Retroactive to September 1, 2020, employees otherwise eligible for Holiday Pay pursuant to Article 12 who take a budgetary leave day the day before and/or the day after an observed City holiday shall be eligible to Holiday Pay as provided in Article 12.
2. This agreement will sunset on December 31, 2020.
3. This agreement may be modified in writing signed by the Parties.
4. This agreement sets no precedent.
5. All other terms and conditions of the Collective Bargaining Agreement, not specifically mentioned in this letter of agreement, remain in effect.
