Neighborhood Street Reconstruction Project

Basic Approach

Baseline Improvements: guided by Minneapolis Street Design Guide, City policies, and best practices.

- Street Trees according to Minneapolis Park & Recreation Board standards.
- Sidewalks 6 feet wide is standard
- Grass Boulevard goal of 6 feet wide.
- Decorative Street Lights City standard light poles/fixtures.
- Soil enhancements that support tree health.

Expanded Enhancements: Could be added to the project with some combination of 1) commercial property owner petition to create a Special Service District (added property tax), 2) capture of dedicated outside funding, 3) other funding or maintenance agreements.

• Specialty Pavements in Boulevards and on Sidewalks – could include colored concrete or brick (including reuse of existing street brick).

* Reuse of brick for street paving is a different topic being considered for the project.

• Street Furnishings – could include benches, trash receptacles, bike racks, food truck hookups.

• Art – could include sculpture, pavement markings, murals, custom railings, custom furnishings.

• Landscaping – including ornamental grasses, perennials, bulbs, shrubs.

• Landscaped Buffers – including landscaping and/or railings between sidewalks and private parking areas as space allows.



Baseline Improvements:

Street Trees – according to MPRB standards.

Sidewalks – 6 ft wide standard, 7.5 ft if adjacent to curb.

Grass Boulevard – goal 6 ft wide.

Decorative Street Lights – City standard light poles/fixtures.

Soil enhancements that support tree health

Expanded Enhancements:

Specialty Pavements – could include colored concrete or brick (including reuse of existing street brick). Reuse of brick for street paving is being considered.

Street Furnishings – ex: benches, trash receptacles, bike racks, fencing food truck hookups.

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Landscaped Buffers – landscaping and/or railings between sidewalks and private parking areas as space allows.







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








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Tyler St NE (@13th intersection looking north)



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
