Lingering germs: germs can stay in a room up to 2 hours even after a sick person has left it.

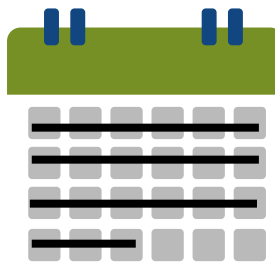


Protect your child

The MMR Immunization protects against measles, mumps, and rubella. Doctors recommend that your child get 2 doses of MMR for best protection.

Dose 1
12-15 months

Dose 2
4-6 years



Unvaccinated people exposed to measles must stay home and away from others for 21 days.

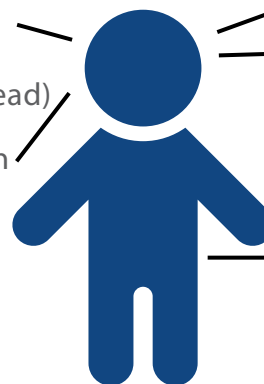
Symptoms of measles

Ear infection



Red Eyes

Runny Nose
