



The City will issue a Request for Proposals (RFP) for a partner to manage and operate community space.

#### ) Space:

- The community space will be an independent 8,000 square-foot suite separate from the remaining facility.
- The community space will have an entrance at the corner of Lake and Minnehaha.
- The selected partner will be included in the design and buildout process.

- Proposals should include community-oriented activities, including social, cultural, and/or business services.






Black respondents believe the redevelopment will contribute to racial healing more than any other racial group.



# Themes emerged from the focus groups



- 36 participants in 6 focus groups
- Mixed reactions with some supporting the EVS use and others expressing concerns about what they perceive to be a limited use
- Social services and a museum were the top choices for community use space; participants expressed interest in the use complementing existing businesses and bringing vibrancy to the community
- Varying perspectives about the redevelopment's contribution to racial healing, with some believing it will contribute and some that it won't
- Frustration and mistrust from a variety of perspectives
