

# PHILLIPS TRAFFIC SAFETY PHASE 2

Improving streets in the Phillips neighborhoods to make them safer for all users.

## Project overview

- E. 26th Street from Blaisdell Ave S to Hiawatha Avenue and E. 28th Street from Stevens to 21<sup>st</sup> Avenues
- E. 27th Street from 12<sup>th</sup> Ave S to Longfellow Ave
- Aim of the project is to reduce speeding and improve traffic safety
- Safety improvements will benefit all street users
- Phase 1 will construct traffic safety improvements in 2025 on E. 24th Street from Park to Cedar Avenues and;
  - Intersections of: E. 25th St / Chicago Ave, E. 28th St / Chicago Ave, and E. 28th St / 10th Ave S

## What we know

- Many high injury streets, streets that have crashes resulting in serious injury or death, are identified in the Phillips neighborhoods
- High vehicle speeds and dangerous driving create unsafe conditions for those walking, rolling, using transit, or driving

## Reported crashes

Reported crashes by travel mode along project route (2019 - August 2024)

	Pedestrian:	5 reported crashes	100% crashes with injuries
	Bicycle:	8 reported crashes	88% crashes with injuries
	Motor Vehicle:	139 reported crashes	31% crashes with injuries
<b>Total Crashes:</b>		<b>152 reported crashes</b>	<b>36% crashes with injuries</b>
