



Peoples' Way Technical Study

On June 30, 2023, the City of Minneapolis purchased the Peoples' Way property at 3744 Chicago Ave. The community continues to use the space for gathering.

In preparation for the future Request for Qualifications (RFQ), the City conducted a technical study to identify limitations and opportunities for future development on the site. This study is guided by the design goals and engagement themes from previous workshops and the Design Requirements listed below. A future community developer will create the final design for the Peoples' Way.

Timeline:

2024

• The City encourages all community members to be part of the GFS Visioning Workshop series.

Aug. 27, 2024 - GFS Visioning Workshop

Sept. 24, 2024 - GFS Visioning Workshop

Fall 2024 - City to issue the RFQ

- Some events will include discussion on the future of the Peoples' Way.
- The City will incorporate the community's priorities into an RFQ process to select the site developer. The RFQ is a way for the City to ask interested groups to apply to the City to become the future stewards of the site.
- The RFQ will be open for approximately two months.

2025

- City staff will work with community members to recommend one site developer to the City Council and the Mayor.
- The Mayor and City Council will make the final selection. The selected developer, community, and City staff will work together to shape the future of the site.
