Manual Revision – <u>9-108</u> <u>9-110 Prisoner Control, Safety and Transportation of Arrestees</u>

**Introduction:** This policy is being updated to specify situations when arrestees should be transported separately, and to make other clarifying changes.

Effective with the issuance of this Special Order, Section 9-108 of the MPD Policy and Procedure Manual shall be amended as follows:

# **9-108 9-110 Prisoner Control, Safety and Transportation of Arrestees** (05/29/02) (06/13/14) (07/19/18) (xx/xx/24)

# A. Minor and Adult Arrestees

This policy applies to minor and adult arrestees.

#### **B.** Felony Arrestees

**A.** When feasible, a <u>T</u>two-<u>member officer</u>-squads shall be used to transport-a felony <u>arrestees, whenever feasible prisoner</u>.

## C. Misdemeanor Arrestees

**B.** One-<u>member officer</u> squads may transport misdemeanor <u>arrestees prisoners</u>.

## **D.** Arrestee and Officer Gender

- 1. C. When feasible, a <u>T</u>two-<u>member officer squads</u> shall be used to transport an arrestee of the opposite <u>gender</u>, <u>whenever feasible sex</u>.
  - <u>a.</u> 1. Officers Members transporting an arrestee of the opposite gender sex shall give the Minneapolis Emergency Communications Center (MECC) their destination and odometer reading.
  - <u>b.</u> <u>a. Officers Members</u> shall immediately notify MECC of any delay.
  - c. b. Upon arrival at their destination, members officers shall notify MECC.

- 2. Except in exigent circumstances, arrestees of different genders shall not be transported in the same compartment.
- 3. Transgender and gender non-confirming arrestees shall be transported alone, whenever feasible (P&P 7-3001).

# **E.** Separating Arrestees for Investigative Purposes

Members should transport co-defendants separately, especially prior to any interview by investigators, whenever feasible.

# F. Securing Arrestees

**E.** Transporting officers Members conducting the transport are responsible for ensuring the safety of their arrestees prisoners.

- 1. <u>Prisoners Arrestees</u> shall be secured with fastened seatbelts during transport in any vehicle equipped with seat belts.
  - a. If the vehicle is not equipped with <u>functional</u> seat belts in the transportation area, <u>members officers</u>-shall document in their report the lack of seat belts and the reason(s) that particular vehicle was used for the transport.
  - b. If circumstances prevent <u>members officers</u> from safely securing the <u>arrestee prisoner</u>, the <u>arrestee prisoner</u> will be transported unsecured. The <u>members officers</u> must document the specific reason(s) for the unsecured transport in their report.
- 2. <u>Members conducting the transport Transporting officers</u> shall not stop or interrupt prisoner transport responsibilities unless exigent circumstances exist and the risk to the arrestee prisoner is minimal.
- 3. Under no circumstances shall an arrestee prisoner be transported in the prone position (P&P 7-350). (06/13/14)

# **G.** Monitoring Arrestees

- 1. D. All Members conducting the transport shall frequently monitor the arrestee prisoners shall remain within sight of the transporting officers at all times until the custody of the arrestee prisoner is transferred to a responsible authority, except in emergency situations. Transporting members shall ensure the arrestee is within sight during transport.
- 2. G. Once the <u>arrestee subject</u> is secured with the squad and during transport, a member an officer shall watch for any of the following signs: (06/13/14)
  - Significant change in behavior or level consciousness.
  - Shortness of breath or irregular breathing:
  - Seizures or convulsions;
  - Complaints of serious pain or injury; and/or
  - Any other serious medical problem.

3. H. If members officers observe any serious medical issue, they shall immediately provide medical attention and contact EMS, in accordance with P&P 7-350 or transport directly to a local hospital. Members Officers shall also notify a supervisor. (06/13/14)

# **H.** Receiving Facility Rules

**F.** When transporting <u>arrestees prisoners</u> to a detention facility, <u>members officers</u> shall comply with MPD rules, regulations and requirements until the <u>arrestee prisoner</u> is secure within the destination facility. <u>Members Officers</u> will then comply with the rules, regulations and procedures of the receiving facility. <u>(06/13/14)</u>

# I. Arrestee Escape

**I.** In the event of an arrestee prisoner escape during transport, the members conducting the transport transporting officers shall immediately do the following:

- 1. Notify the dispatcher of the event and location.
- 2. Attempt pursuit if feasible possible.
- 3. Notify a supervisor or proper jurisdictional authority of the escape.
- 4. Complete the original arrest report, noting the escape from custody.

# J. Coordination Through a Supervisor

- 1. If there are not enough on-scene resources to transport the arrestees (because of gender, separating arrestees, etc.), members shall notify a supervisor. The supervisor shall determine whether the transportation shall wait for additional squads or be completed by the on-scene squads.
- 2. The members and supervisor shall document the notification, determination (whether transport will wait or be completed by on-scene resources), and reasons for the determination in the Police Report.
